HONORING PATRIOT DAY - September 11, 2001

- 9:03 a.m. United Airlines Flight 175 was flown into the South Tower of the World Trade Center in Manhattan, New York
- 9:37 a.m. American Airlines Flight 77 was flown into the west side of the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia
- 10:03 a.m. United Airlines Flight 93 crashed in a field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania

THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE SCHOOL BOARD OF INDIAN RIVER COUNTY, FLORIDA, that we honor September 11th as Patriot Day, will teach our students age-appropriate standards driven lessons regarding the events that occurred on September 11, 2001, will hold a moment of silence at each time above when possible, and conduct Patriot Day activities in all schools to ensure our students will never forget.
